In Euripides' <u>Hekabe</u>, the ghost of Achilles delays the Greek ships from sailing home and demands the sacrifice of the Trojan princess Polyxena, who has been reduced to slavery with her mother, Hekabe. Odysseus has come to take Polyxena away to be sacrificed, and Hekabe has failed to convince him to spare her daughter or at least to sacrifice her as well. Polyxena, who is now resolved to die, addresses her mother.
